TSIA College Readiness Exam



The Texas Success Initiative (TSIA2) is a state legislated program designed to improve student success in college by requiring all students attending public institutions of higher education, unless considered [TSIA2 Exempt](#), to complete assessment in reading, writing and mathematics before enrolling in classes. Preparing for assessments is encouraged since test scores determine course placement. Students scoring below college level readiness are required to enroll in developmental courses which do not apply towards a degree or certificate.

TSIA is the most used exam/tool to qualify students for Dual Credit courses.

iSVA offers the TSIA Exam free of charge and allows its students the opportunity to take it virtually from the comfort of your home.

Financial Aid & Scholarships



The Free Application for Federal Student Aid, or FAFSA, is the form that the federal government, states, colleges and other organizations use to award financial aid.

Submitting it is your key to accessing grants, scholarships, work-study programs and federal student loans.

Completing the FAFSA is the first step for anyone making college plans.

Heads up:

- The redesigned FAFSA is expected to launch in December 2023 for the 2024-25 academic year — a delay from the typical Oct. 1 release date.
- Beginning in 2024-2025, FAFSA completion will be a multi-step process rather than a single event. Students and parents will have to complete their portions of the FAFSA separately rather than co-signing a single application. The way this works is that a student will complete the portion of their FAFSA that pertains to them specifically – their basic information and their own financial information if they happened to work or file taxes – and then hit submit to complete the student portion. When this is done, FAFSA will send an email to the parent or parents required on the FAFSA asking them to login and complete their portion of the

application, which will be separate from the student and completely inaccessible by them. The parent will click on that link in their email, log in with their FSA ID, complete their section, and hit submit also, which will finish the application and send it to the student's selected schools.

iSVA will be conducting FAFSA presentations throughout the year. Presentations will be crucial for parents and students to understand this complicated process and required items needed to properly fill it out.

iSVA in partnership with Lone Star College Financial Aid Office will also host FAFSA Workshops throughout the year. These workshops will assist students and families in filling out the application. The student and family will receive immediate results upon completing the application.

All 12th graders are required to submit this document for graduation purposes.

January graduates will have access to the FAFSA course on September 11, 2023. You will complete your FAFSA application during this required course or submit an Opt Out Form. The course has to be completed by the end of Semester 1 as it is a graduation requirement.

All June graduates will have access to the FAFSA course in January, 2024.

What can students and families do to help the process go smoothly?

Practice the 4 "P"s: be Proactive, be Prepared, be Patient, and be Problem-Solvers.

Proactive – Start attempting to do the FAFSA as early as you can to allow wiggle room in case you encounter difficulties.

Prepared – The student and at least one parent need to create their FSA IDs at least a few days before beginning a FAFSA application. If the parents didn't file jointly that year, *both* parents must create FSA IDs. If anyone has an FSA ID from a prior FAFSA and can't get into it using password reset emails or texts, they can call the FSA ID Help line at 1-800-433-3243 for assistance. Parents should check all of their information, especially their emails and legal last names, to ensure they are accurate and don't need to be updated. If parent information on their FSA ID needs to be updated, do that on <https://studentaid.gov> at least 3 days before attempting to do the FAFSA. Also, everyone should still have their tax returns with them (physical or electronic) just in case the IRS Data Retrieval fails and you have to enter information manually.

Patient – Don't rush through the application, don't get frustrated by website errors (there will likely be many, given all the changes), and don't give in to the temptation to start mailing signature pages at the first sign of difficulty. Parents and students should make every possible effort to get their FAFSA signed electronically in case there is a paperwork bottleneck at FAFSA's processing

center when it comes to mailed signature pages. Read the application carefully and slowly, enter the exact information requested, and read any error messages carefully.

Problem-Solvers – 90% of FAFSA issues come down to two problems:

- *Information entered on FSA ID is out of date or incorrect* – Name should be each person’s legal name on file with the Social Security Administration. No nicknames, shorthand, middle names used as first names, old last names that didn’t get updated after a marriage or divorce, etc.
- *Information on the FAFSA doesn’t match information on FSA ID* – The student or parent got their personal information right in one place, then wrong in another. When possible, check the FSA ID first by logging in on <https://studentaid.gov>, hovering over the person’s name, clicking “Settings,” then clicking “Personal Information.” If the information there is wrong, correct and wait 1-3 days for confirmation that it went through okay. If the FSA ID information there is right, check the FAFSA and correct it there.

- At least 22 high school credits and a final GPA equivalent to 3.0 or higher
- Additional academic requirements, including college readiness test scores, STAAR exam participation, and demonstration of mastery in various subjects

If you graduate two or more semesters early, you'll receive a two-semester scholarship, worth several thousand dollars, to a participating university.

If you graduate one semester early, you'll receive a one-semester scholarship to a participating university.

You may also be eligible for additional financial aid at most of these institutions!

The Texas First Diploma does not guarantee automatic admission for students. Consult your counselor for guidance on whether your grade point average at graduation qualifies you for automatic admission under the state's top 10 percent law.

You can apply to any college or university you choose. However, the scholarship will only apply toward participating universities, listed above.

Use it or lose it! The scholarship offer will expire at the end of the first academic year following your graduation, so we encourage you to attend college directly after high school.

Dual Credit Program



Dual Credit enables a high school student to earn credit towards high school graduation while simultaneously earning college credit towards an Associate's degree or workforce program certificate. In the LSC-Online dual credit program, students demonstrating college readiness through a college placement exam can receive both college credit and high school credit while still enrolled in high school or homeschool.

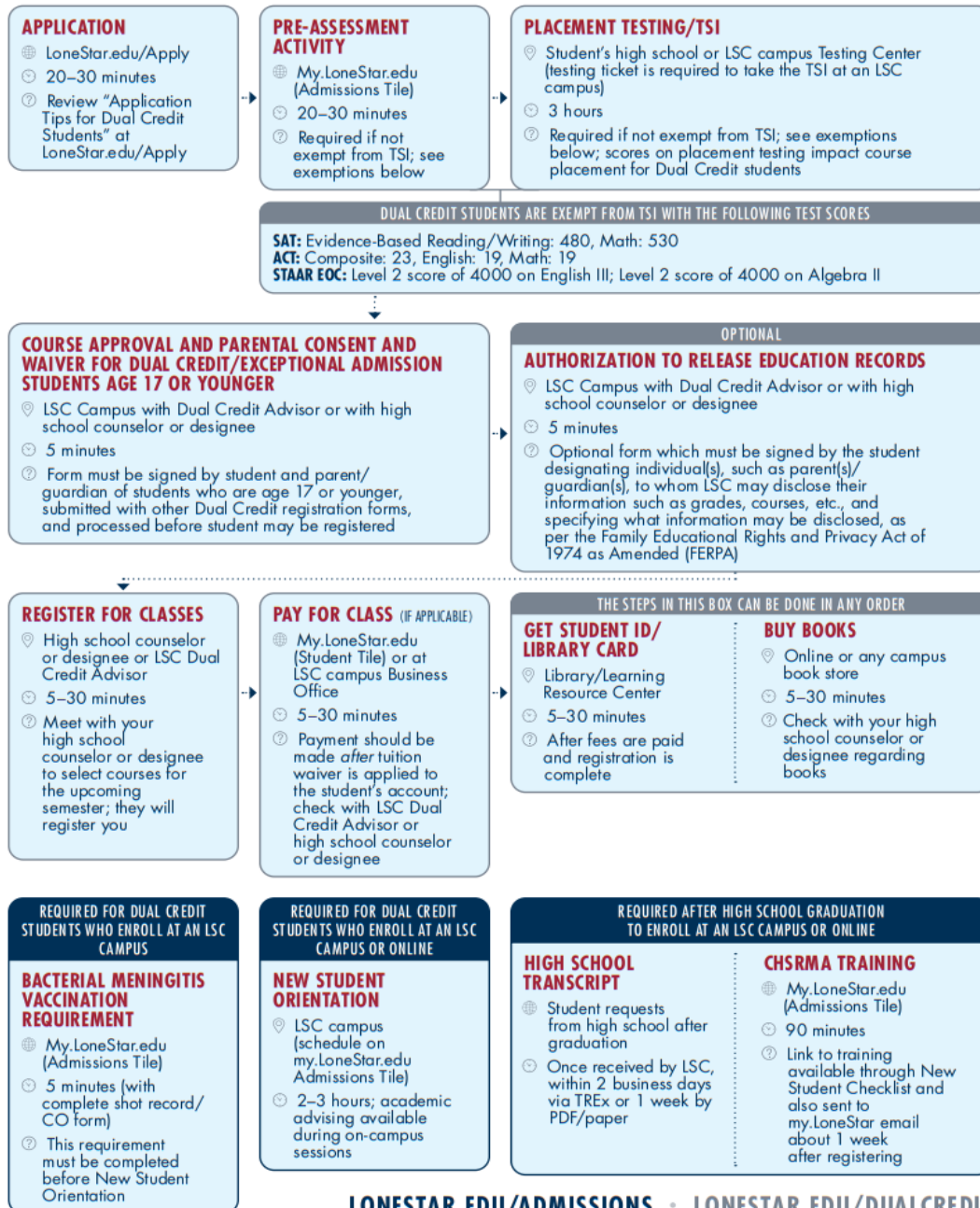

READY TO APPLY TO LONE STAR COLLEGE AND BECOME A DUAL CREDIT STUDENT?

Below are some tips to help Dual Credit applicants complete the ApplyTexas application. The tips follow the order they appear; however, there are also questions applicants will be required to answer to complete the application.

TIP 1 After selecting *Two-year community/junior college* and *Lone Star College* in the “Start/Edit Applications” section of the application, select *Dual Credit* as the application type.

TIP 4 Below are three tips to help you successfully answer the questions in the “Texas Residency” section:

- 1 You are a *dependent* if a parent/guardian or multiple parents/guardians provide financial support for you (examples: you live in or sometimes stay at their house where they pay the bills, they pay for your food, clothes, etc).
- 2 If you are a dependent then *the majority of financial support* for you is provided by a parent/guardian or multiple parents/guardians (examples: you live in or sometimes stay at their house where they pay the bills, they pay for your food, clothes, etc).
- 3 The Texas Independent School District (ISD) where you reside is *the ISD where your house or apartment is located*. This may be different from the ISD where you go to school. If you or your parents own a house, select the ISD to which property taxes are paid. If you or your parents rent a house or apartment, the landlord or apartment complex management can help you determine which ISD you reside in.

Dual Credit Pathways

Each student could have **3** distinct pathways to pursue Dual Credit through the iSVA and Lone Star College partnership depending on their eligibility through the Texas Success Initiative.

The pathways include: **General Dual Credit, Dual Credit Core Complete, and Dual Credit- Collegiate Academy.**

Each pathway shares benefits to support the educational goals of students but also has unique features.

Each pathway allows high school students to enroll in college courses for credit prior to high school graduation.

College credits earned through these pathways can be applied toward high school and college graduation and can be transferred to other colleges or universities.

General Dual Credit Pathway:

The goal of this pathway is for students to complete between 3-24 credit hours.

The following courses (24 credit hours) included in this option are:

Dual Credit Core Complete Pathway:

The goal of this program is for students to complete 45 credit hours.

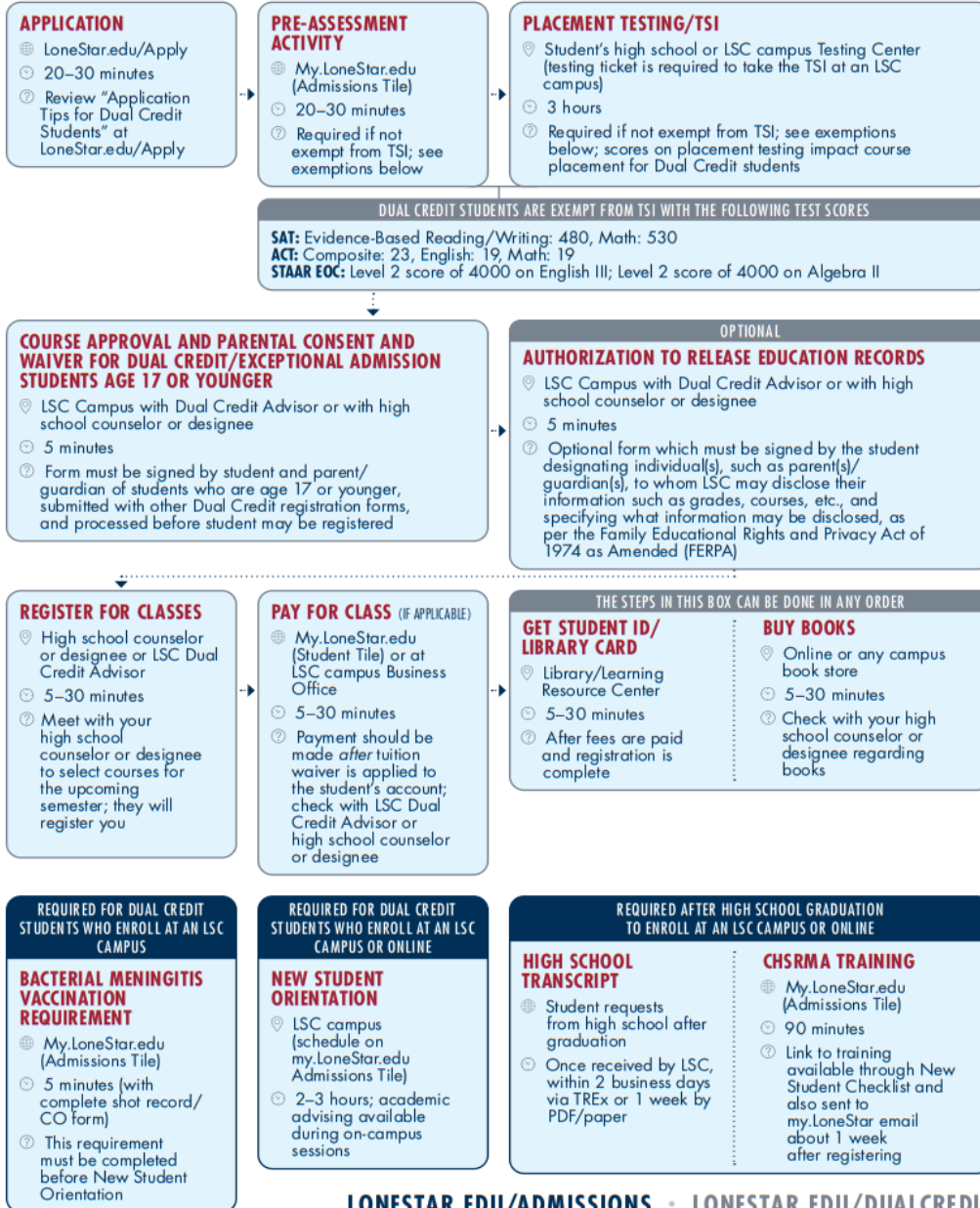
Dual Credit Eligibility Requirements

- Be enrolled at iSVA
- Obtain approval from the high school designee for dual credit enrollment
- Complete Lone Star College admissions requirements
- Meet prerequisites for the course(s) you want to take for dual credit

* Unlike the standard Dual Credit program, the CTE Dual Credit program does not require the TSIA Exam to enroll in courses.

READY TO APPLY TO LONE STAR COLLEGE AND BECOME A DUAL CREDIT STUDENT?

Below are some tips to help Dual Credit applicants complete the ApplyTexas application. The tips follow the order they appear; however, there are also questions applicants will be required to answer to complete the application.

TIP 1 After selecting *Two-year community/junior college* and *Lone Star College* in the "Start/Edit Applications" section of the application, select *Dual Credit* as the application type.

- 1 You are a *dependent* if a parent/guardian or multiple parents/guardians provide financial support for you (examples: you live in or sometimes stay at their house where they pay the bills, they pay for your food, clothes, etc).
- 2 If you are a dependent then *the majority of financial support* for you is provided by a parent/guardian or multiple parents/guardians (examples: you live in or sometimes stay at their house where they pay the bills, they pay for your food, clothes, etc).
- 3 The Texas Independent School District (ISD) where you reside is *the ISD where your house or apartment is located*. This may be different from the ISD where you go to school. If you or your parents own a house, select the ISD to which property taxes are paid. If you or your parents rent a house or apartment, the landlord or apartment complex management can help you determine which ISD you reside in.
